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CCSM Policies

PAYMENTS & FEES

Registration Fee & Payment

A one-time \$20 registration fee is applied to the account of each new student. Returning students will not incur a registration fee. *Once initial lessons are scheduled, payment is due before the first lesson.*

Invoices & Late Fees

Invoices are emailed on the first of each month, and payment is due at that time for that month's upcoming lessons. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to a student's account for past-due balances.

Payment Methods Accepted

We accept cash, check or credit/debit card (Visa, Mastercard, Discover, American Express). *Please note that a 3% convenience fee will be applied to all credit/debit card payments, online or in person. Direct bank account payments or ACH payments are also accepted and incur a 0.8% convenience fee.*

CANCELLED CLASSES / WORKSHOPS / ENSEMBLES

CCSM reserves the right to cancel group classes if enrollment does not meet the required minimum number of students. In the event that a class is cancelled, the parent/student will be contacted, and the tuition of the class will be refunded. Please note that registration fees are non-refundable.

STUDENT-MISSED LESSON

Out of courtesy, students should notify their instructor of any absence for any reason. However, prior notification does NOT exempt the student from payment. There will be no makeup lessons for private instruction or classes in cases of student absences. As a reminder, during your child's absence, no matter if it is cold, flu, Covid-19, vacation, or just staying home for the day, your tuition amount stays the same. Tuition works the same as rent. No matter if your child is in attendance or not, your tuition rate always charges. You are paying for your space in the program, not your attendance. (If you anticipate a prolonged absence of two or more weeks, inform the instructor as soon as possible, and then contact the CCSM office. (See withdrawal policy below.) With Executive Director approval, we may adjust your account.)

INSTRUCTOR-MISSED LESSON

If an instructor is absent, the lesson will be marked "Teacher Canceled" with NO CHARGE to the family, or the instructor will reschedule at a mutually convenient time. Rescheduled lessons missed by the student will not be made up and charges will apply.

COVID-19 & QUARANTINE POLICY

If a student is forced to quarantine due to possible exposure, an online lesson will be offered. If the online lesson is declined or missed by the family/student, the student will be marked absent and the lesson is billable. In the event that a student tests positive for COVID-19, a negative test reult is required for the student to return to in-person lessons. CCSM Policies

WITHDRAWAL/PROLONGED ABSENCE & REFUND POLICY

Private Instruction

In the event of a withdrawal or prolonged absence, the responsible party should first notify the instructor as soon as possible and set the date for the last lesson. Once the instructor is notified, the CCSM office must be informed of the withdrawal or absence by the responsible party in writing; email is acceptable. Verbal notice is not accepted. Tuition refunds will be considered by the Executive Director OR CCSM Board Treasurer on a case-by-case basis. Registration and late fees are non-refundable.

Group Classes/Workshop/Ensembles

No refunds will be considered after the 1st class meeting.

LIABILITY

Upon submission of tuition payment, parents or legal guardians agree that CCSM shall in no manner be liable for any accident, injury, loss, theft, or damage which may be sustained on the premises in conjunction with any school-related activity or function.

MARKETING

It is the practice of CCSM to take photographs and videos at various events and to use them to market future programs (may be posted on our website, social media, and/or used in catalogs). If you would prefer that we NOT use your photograph, please contact the school office and submit a signed "Opt-Out" form.

Private Lessons

Private Lesson Process & Policy

New and current student referrals for private lessons are carefully handled by our staff, teachers, and coordinated by the president of the CCSM Board of Directors. Careful thought is given to schedule, availability, level, and experience when selecting a teacher/student match. It is our goal to provide the best possible educational experience for every student enrolled in our programs.

CCSM has a 3-step registration process for private lesson referrals that generally takes a week upon submission of the registration form.

- 1) Begin a private lesson referral in-person at the school or at www.claremontmusic-org/Registration-and-Payments.
- 2) A CCSM teacher will contact you to set up a start date/time and email you a brief overview of their background, experience, qualifications, and any additional information.
- 3) Complete registration by contacting the office with your start date/time. A registrar will process the registration and email an invoice.

Private lessons are open to new and continuing students and all lesson arrangements are made directly with the corresponding instructor. Private lessons are available on most instruments. Suzuki instruction is available for violin, viola, cello, guitar and piano.

Virtual Lessons: For students not wanting to have in-person lessons, virtual lessons are possible via Zoom, Skype, or FaceTime.

Private lesson students joining CCSM for the first time will register for a four-lesson consultation period (trial lessons). This consultation period allows the students and teachers to get to know each other. (If a student chooses to withdraw prior to the 4th lesson taught, a full refund will be given minus the cost of the initial given lessons.) After this consultation period, it is expected that students will commit to weekly lessons for the remainder of the school year (billable monthly). There are no makeups or refunds for student-missed lessons (see page 4).

Full-term enrollment is required and pro-rated based on week of entry. Tuition payments are due on the 1st of the month (for the forthcoming month), billed September—June. A one-time \$20 student registration fee is applied to each new student account. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to the student's account for past-due balances.

If you will be taking private lessons through a charter school, we must receive the purchase order/ enrichment certificate BEFORE your student will be allowed to start lessons. Please make sure to allow plenty of time for your charter school to generate the PO and send it to us.

Master Private Lessons

Master Teachers are available to instruct students of any age and ability who demonstrate a commitment to serious music study. The program is open to everyone, but also includes students who are considering career paths in the world of music or for those desiring to reach artist-level capacity on their voice or instrument. Master teachers are our most highly qualified instructors and possess at least a Master of Arts degree in music (or comparable certification and/or experience teaching at CCSM), widespread performing experience at the artist level, and very strong pedagogical skills.

Master Private lessons may be taken in 30, 45, or 60 minute increments and enable students to progress at a highly motivated pace. It gives the opportunity for advanced students to prepare for performances, auditions and competitions. Students explore varied repertoire and are placed in demanding arenas to accelerate their study of music.

CCSM is proud to partner with many charter and homeschool programs throughout our community and the surrounding area, with well over 14 different partnerships. As these programs require extensive reporting per lesson and vary in administrative scope and sequence, the following single-lesson rate structure applies accordingly:

Group Classes

Group Class Process & Policy

CCSM has a 3-step registration process for group class registrations that generally takes between 3-5 days upon submission of the registration form.

- 1) Begin a group class registration in-person at the school or at www.claremontmusic-org/Registration-and-Payments.
- 2) Student will be enrolled by a registrar.
- 3) An invoice for the group class will be emailed to you.

Group classes must be paid for in-full at the time of registration. Some classes may require materials which are to be purchased ahead of time via the listed online link. Classes may be cancelled for insufficient enrollment. If a class is cancelled, the tuition of the class will be refunded.

CHARTER STUDENTS: If you will be taking group classes through a charter school, we must receive the purchase order/enrichment certificate BEFORE your student will be allowed to start any classes. Please make sure to allow plenty of time for your charter school to generate the PO and send it to us.

Classes are in-person, unless otherwise indicated, and are subject to change in accordance with public health guidelines.

In this wonderful class, our youngest music makers will discover steady beat through fun lap games, floor games and even folk dancing with a parent or caregiver. Infants will participate by responding to songs with intuitive and gross motor skill instruments including bells, shakers, the welcoming drum, and colorful scarves. Parents will learn how to encourage their infant in music play and singing, while increasing their personal repertoire of children's folk music. A new theme is introduced each session so this class may be taken multiple times.

In this joyful class, toddlers practice music concepts, including high and low, loud and soft, fast and slow, and steady beat by jumping, tiptoeing, walking, running, and even rolling on the floor. These young musicians will explore simple rhythms using beautiful instruments including drums, triangles, bells, and shakers. Group Class - Guitar

BEGINNING GUITAR Ages 8 - 12

This six-week course is designed for students with no previous musical experience. We will learn how to solve obstacles related to guitar playing at the beginning level, focusing on a fingerstyle approach, also known as classical. The student will learn the parts of the guitar, how to read music and tablature, proper right- and left-hand techniques, how to sit comfortably, and how to build awareness. By the end of the course, the student will be able to play through simple melodies such as "Hot Cross Buns," "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star," and others. This course is a great place to begin learning techniques and concepts that will open doors to all genres.

BROADWAY MUSICAL THEATRE WORKSHOP - MINI CAMP IVRT

Mini Camp IVRT combines singing, acting and movement in a positive, affirming atmosphere. Students will work together as a team, practice empathy, learn to listen and react, and develop critical thinking skills. Through educational games and exercises, students learn to express themselves confidently and think quickly without fear of making mistakes. 

Because of its intimate nature, chamber music has been described as "the music of friends". Playing chamber music requires special skills, both musical and social, that differ from the skills required for playing solo or symphonic works. Chamber music groups at CCSM are created and coordinated based on the number, instrumentation, and level of interested participants. Rehearsal times are based on the availability of students and rehearsal space. On average, rehearsals and lessons occur one time per week for approximately one hour throughout the school year. SUZUKI PIANO & STRING ORIENTATION — MANDATORY

This orientation is required of all new Suzuki violin, viola, cello, guitar, and piano students, as well as new families to the program. Highlights from the "Nurtured by Love" video introduce music-making in the Suzuki manner. Teachers will present key topics: talent, education, listening, and the roles of the parent at home and during lessons. After the opening session, families will attend a more detailed explanation of the program by instrument in different rooms. If the orientation needs to be virtual, the different instrumental groups will meet with the instructors after the opening session. There will be time for questions in the smaller group. The orientation will be held in person, but in the event that it cannot be held in Huff Hall, it will be held VIRTUALLY OVER ZOOM with the specific instrumental instructor (cello, guitar, piano, viola/violin). The orientation will last approximately 1.5 hours.

SUZUKI STRINGS (VIOLIN & VIOLA) PRE-TWINKLERS AGES 3 - 7 + PARENT

The Suzuki Violin & Viola Program is designed for students ages 3-7 years old (or by permission of Ms. Tajima).

Dr. Shin'ichi Suzuki developed this incredibly exciting approach to human potential through the study of music. He realized that babies have a very high ability to learn from birth and that through the use of imitation, human beings can learn to a very high degree by the awareness of our surroundings. By using imitative skills, we learn by listening to speech patterns that surround us. We don't learn by someone handing us a book and saying, "Read it!" By being read to, spoken to, and by hearing music, our cognitive skills are built to a very high degree! When lessons begin, by using imitation, we learn how to move and feel the music!

Dr. Suzuki has organized repertoire that the student will learn over the course of 10 books, and each piece introduces a technique to be mastered before moving to other repertoire. The beginning student needs to know how to hold the instrument well before placing the bow on the string for ultimate success! The students learn techniques through the use of games, and learned repertoire is reviewed and performed with other students who know the same pieces! As students become more advanced, they are also introduced to more advanced techniques, which are then used in earlier songs. An important component to learning is LISTENING TO THE CD to introduce how the solo and piano accompaniment fit together, as well as realizing the style of the work.

The ROLE OF THE PARENT/GUARDIAN is also very, very important. It is with this in mind that the parent/guardian must be able to work with the child and understand what is expected. At home you are the "home teacher," and during lessons you are the "secretary"! Regular attendance and practice are essential to progress! *This class is a year-long commitment in conjunction with private lessons.*

STRING THEORY, EAR TRAINING, MASTERCLASS: STEM - PROGRAM A AGES 12 - 15

The STEM A Program is for advancing violinists and violists, 12-15 years old, at the Intermediate level (Suzuki Book 4-6/7; CM 4-6). During this 11-session program, students will learn about more advanced theory (major and minor keys, building chords/arpeggios, and intervals). Students will also practice sight reading, ear training, and musical style of repertoire, including the interpretation of the repertoire. Two topics will usually be covered each session and theory will be included during most sessions.

Attendance and diligence in studying what has been covered is very important. If students do not complete the homework or take the time to study what has been assigned, this holds back both the class and the individual student. If you (the student) have a question, please DO NOT HESITATE TO ASK IT! DO NOT SAY THAT YOU DON'T KNOW HOW TO ASK IT.... We learn so much by asking, and if we are fearful of saying the incorrect answer, we let ourselves down. There is NO SUCH THING AS A SILLY QUESTION!

During the masterclass sessions, by listening and watching, our comments help each other understand how the music is coming across to the audience! We may think we know but really don't. Video cameras are also useful! By video-recording students, it helps them see their posture, including what the bow is doing to help or hinder them. Masterclasses are wonderful for students to receive feedback on how they present themselves in a performance!

STRING THEORY, EAR TRAINING, MASTERCLASS: STEM - PROGRAM B AGES 12 - 16

The STEM B Program is designed to give the advanced student the knowledge necessary to become a competent performer, while being able to spend more time learning about theory, music history, and ear training. The B Session consists of students around CM levels 7-9. We will cover two topics almost every session. There is homework that needs to be completed between sessions. If there are questions, please be sure to ask them!

During the masterclasses, students will critique each other's performances, whether it is part of a piece, something being prepared for an upcoming recital or evaluation, or something that a student has learned in the past. Several designated sessions will be performed with an accompanist, and the entire work can be critiqued. This gives students the opportunity to become acquainted with different styles of music while broadening their understanding of music, whether familiar with a composer being performed or not!

Theory study will be included in most of the sessions, and a few will include ear training. It is critically important that students understand basic theory and music history. If a student has not made the time to study thoroughly and learn the material assigned, it will slow down both the individual student's progress and that of the entire class. Being on top of each assignment for EVERY CLASS IS IMPERATIVE!
