PAYMENTS & FEES

Registration Fee & Payment

A one-time \$20 registration fee is applied to the account of each new student. Returning students will not incur a registration fee. *Once initial lessons are scheduled, payment is due before the first lesson.*

Invoices & Late Fees

Invoices are emailed at the first of each month and payment is due at that time for that month's upcoming lessons. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to a student's account for past-due balances.

Payment Methods Accepted

We accept cash, check or credit/debit card (Visa, Mastercard, Discover, American Express). *Please note that a 3% convenience fee will be applied to all credit/debit card payments, online or in person. Direct bank account payments or ACH payments are also accepted and incur a 0.8% convenience fee.*

CANCELLED CLASSES / WORKSHOPS / ENSEMBLES

CCSM reserves the right to cancel group classes if enrollment does not meet the required minimum number of students. In the event that a class is cancelled, the parent/student will be contacted and the tuition of the class will be refunded. Please note that registration fees are non-refundable.

STUDENT MISSED LESSON

Out of courtesy, students should notify their instructor of any absence for any reason. *However, prior* notification does not exempt the student from payment. There will be no makeup lessons for private instruction or classes in cases of student absences. CCSM is committed to pay the teacher for the time you have scheduled; therefore, this policy is strictly enforced. If you anticipate a prolonged absence of two (2) or more weeks, inform the instructor as soon as possible, and then contact the CCSM office. (See withdrawal below.) With Executive Director approval, we may adjust your account.

INSTRUCTOR MISSED LESSON

If an instructor is absent, the lesson will be rescheduled at a mutually convenient time. **Rescheduled** *lessons missed by the student will not be made up.*

COVID-19 & QUARANTINE POLICY

If a student is forced to quarantine due to possible exposure, an online lesson will be offered. If the online lesson is declined or missed by the family/student, the student will be marked absent and the lesson is billable. In the event that a student tests positive for COVID-19, a doctor's note is required for the student to return to in-person lessons. WITHDRAWAL/PROLONGED ABSENCE* & REFUND POLICY

Private Instruction

In the event of a withdrawal, or prolonged absence, the responsible party should first notify the instructor as soon as possible. **Once the instructor is notified, the CCSM office must be informed of the withdrawal or absence by the responsible party in writing; email is acceptable. Verbal notice is not accepted.** Tuition refunds will be considered by the Executive Director OR CCSM Board Treasurer on a case-by-case basis. Registration and late fees are non-refundable.

Group Classes/Workshop/Ensembles

No refunds will be considered after the 1st class meeting.

Teen hits a sweet note with new music library

Early in the 20th century, before regular radio broadcasts, many people learned to play instruments so they could enjoy music at home. Not surprisingly, during this era sheet music was plentiful and popular tunes would sell in the millions of copies.

Now with big online retailers dominating sales of almost everything, few music stores sell sheet music, particularly if one is looking for obscure or long-forgotten songs. However, one student at the Claremont Community School of Music wants to help locals find the sheet music they seek.

Piano student, Miya Matsumune, 17,

created a music book lending library at the school with literally scores of titles including chamber music, song anthologies, unique arrangements and some on music theory.

Until recently, the books and ephemera were stored in an office space where Claremont Community School of Music Board President Lee Waggoner works. The material had been donated to the school over the years and Waggoner figured there must be a better use for the music than just collecting dust.

"I got to thinking about it because most of the donated music goes to the main office and I have a little desk and pretty soon I could not get to my desk because of the amount of donated music," Waggoner said. "So I just started sorting it and more came and we were running out of space."

So a plan was hatched between the school's Executive Director Matthew Keating, Waggoner and Miya, who was nearing the end of her involvement in Girl Scouts and needed a Gold Award project.

"I kept saying to Matt 'We should figure out something to do with this music," and then Miya had a need for a project and we said we have a project," Waggoner said.

Miya spent more than 80 hours building the display cases, labeling and categorizing all of the music and then arranging the books in her library. The library is located in one of the school's classroom wings and all books are available for anyone in the community, not just the school's students.

"I am lucky enough my teacher, Ms. Maria Perez, found really nice pieces for me when I was a child so I grew up with a variety of classical music. However, I think if I had this opportunity when I was younger I would have loved to pick out my own pieces, and I am definitely going to use it now," Miya said.

Private Lesson Process & Policy

New and current student referrals for private lessons are carefully handled by our staff, teachers, and coordinated by the president of the CCSM Board of Directors. Careful thought is given to schedule, availability, level, and experience when selecting a teacher/student match. It is our goal to provide the best possible educational experience for every student enrolled in our programs.

CCSM has a 3-step registration process for private lesson referrals that generally takes between 3-5 days upon submission of the registration form.

1) Begin a private lesson referral in-person at the school or at <u>www.claremontmusic-org/Registration-and-Payments</u>.

2) A CCSM teacher will contact you to set up a start date/time and email you a brief overview of their background, experience, qualifications, and any additional information.

3) Complete registration by contacting the office with your start date/time. A registrar will process the registration and email an invoice.

Private lessons are open to new and continuing students and all lesson arrangements are made directly with the corresponding teacher (standard or master). Private lessons are available on most instruments. Suzuki instruction is available for violin, viola, cello, guitar and piano.

A one-time \$20 student registration fee is applied to each new student account. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to the student's account for past-due balances.

Virtual Lessons: For students not wanting to have in-person lessons, virtual lessons are possible via Zoom, Skype, or FaceTime.

Master Teacher Private Lessons: Master Teachers are available to instruct students of any age and ability who demonstrate a commitment to serious music study. The program is open to everyone, but also includes students who are considering career paths in the world of music or for those desiring to reach artist-level capacity on their voice or instrument. Master teachers are our most highly qualified instructors and possess at least a Master of Arts degree in music (or comparable certification and/or experience teaching at CCSM), widespread performing experience at the artist level, and very strong pedagogical skills.

Master teacher private lessons may be taken in 30, 45, or 60 minute increments and enable students to progress at a highly motivated pace. It gives the opportunity for advanced students to prepare for performances, auditions and competitions. Students explore varied repertoire and are placed in demanding arenas to accelerate their study of music.

Building the display cases was the most time-consuming part of the project and Waggoner's husband Bill helped by creating blueprints of an existing bookcase and showing Miya how to use a table saw. She then assembled the cases with the assistance of her father.

"I think it's a great opportunity for students to browse and find new things that they love because you can get music books online and you can find sheet music to print out for free. But it's hard to know what you are looking for. Often [internet searches] will suggest the most famous composers and perhaps won't show you a variety of composers," Miya said.

Miya's family all play instruments, as music is something that really brings the family together. She said a typical evening revolves around a family jam session during which they will create their own arrangement of a pop tune or just play improvisational melodies. Her mother plays the flute, dad plays drums and bass, her brother also plays drums and bass, and Miya plays the piano.

Similar to earning the Eagle rank in Boy Scouting, the Gold Award is the highest accomplishment in Girl Scouting and just 5.6% of scouts earn the award. Once a girl enters high school and reaches the senior or ambassador rank she can apply for the Gold Award and select a project.

"Obviously there is a layer to this project that has to do with access to music education because some of these music books are not cheap and being able to access them for free is really important. There are students at Claremont Community School of Music that are on scholarship which I think is really wonderful," Miya said. "The Claremont Community School of Music has always tried to push for inclusivity and access to music education despite socioeconomic status, so I am really happy to contribute to that legacy by helping people access music books and sheet music with no cost."

Keating said at one time there was a sheet music store at the mall in Montclair, but it is long gone. The only local commercial store in the area is Old Town Music in Pasadena. He said even the public library doesn't have sheet music so the one at the school will be unique for the area.

"There are a few places like Styles Music where you can go and get a couple of books but it's not classical. This is going to be the only dedicated sheet music library that I am aware of where you can come and browse and take it and there won't be a cost," Keating said.

The library will be open during the school's regular business hours, Monday through Friday 1 to 6 p.m. and Saturday 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. It will run on the honor system, so you don't have to check a book out like at the public library. The school hopes that when one is done using the book they will simply bring it back. And maybe get another.

"I think that it really helps cultivate passion for music when you are allowed to chose your own pieces and find ones that you really like," Miya said.

CCSM has a 3-step registration process for group class registrations that generally takes between 3-5 days upon submission of the registration form.

3) An invoice for the group class will be emailed to you.

Group classes must be paid for in-full at the time of registration. *Some classes may require materials which are to be purchased ahead of time via the listed online link.* Classes may be cancelled for insufficient enrollment. If a class is cancelled, the tuition of the class will be refunded.

CHARTER STUDENTS: If you will be taking group classes through a charter school, we must receive the purchase order/enrichment certificate BEFORE your student will be allowed to start any classes. Please make sure to allow plenty of time for your charter school to generate the PO and send it to us.
