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PAYMENTS & FEES

Registration Fee & Payment

A one-time \$20 registration fee is applied to the account of each new student. Returning students will not incur a registration fee. ***Once initial lessons are scheduled, payment is due before the first lesson.***

Invoices & Late Fees

Invoices are emailed at the first of each month, and payment is due at that time for that month's upcoming lessons. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to a student's account for past-due balances.

Payment Methods Accepted

We accept cash, check or credit/debit card (Visa, Mastercard, Discover, American Express). *Please note that a 3% convenience fee will be applied to all credit/debit card payments, online or in person. Direct bank account payments or ACH payments are also accepted and incur a 0.8% convenience fee.*

CANCELLED CLASSES / WORKSHOPS / ENSEMBLES

CCSM reserves the right to cancel group classes if enrollment does not meet the required minimum number of students. In the event that a class is cancelled, the parent/student will be contacted, and the tuition of the class will be refunded. Please note that registration fees are non-refundable.

STUDENT MISSED LESSON

Out of courtesy, students should notify their instructor of any absence for any reason. However, prior notification does NOT exempt the student from payment. There will be no makeup lessons for private instruction or classes in cases of student absences. ***As a reminder, during your child's absence, no matter if it is cold, flu, Covid-19, vacation, or just staying home for the day, your tuition amount stays the same. Tuition works the same as rent. No matter if your child is in attendance or not, your tuition rate always charges. You are paying for your space in the program, not your attendance.*** (If you anticipate a prolonged absence of two or more weeks, inform the instructor as soon as possible, and then contact the CCSM office. (See withdrawal policy below.) With Executive Director approval, we may adjust your account.)

INSTRUCTOR MISSED LESSON

If an instructor is absent, the lesson will be rescheduled at a mutually convenient time. ***Rescheduled lessons missed by the student will not be made up.***

COVID-19 & QUARANTINE POLICY

If a student is forced to quarantine due to possible exposure, an online lesson will be offered. If the online lesson is declined or missed by the family/student, the student will be marked absent and the lesson is billable. In the event that a student tests positive for COVID-19, a doctor's note is required for the student to return to in-person lessons. WITHDRAWAL/PROLONGED ABSENCE & REFUND POLICY

Private Instruction

In the event of a withdrawal or prolonged absence, the responsible party should first notify the instructor as soon as possible. ***Once the instructor is notified, the CCSM office must be informed of the withdrawal or absence by the responsible party in writing; email is acceptable. Verbal notice is not accepted.*** Tuition refunds will be considered by the Executive Director OR CCSM Board Treasurer on a case-by-case basis. Registration and late fees are non-refundable.

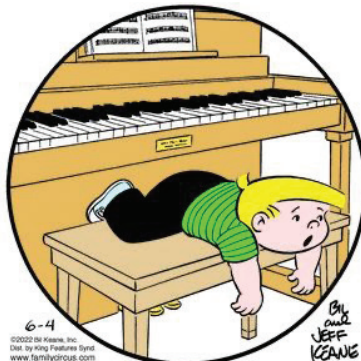

Practice Essentials

- Practice every day. You can become truly accomplished through repetition. Schedule a daily practice time when you are relaxed, but not tired. Think of practice as “play time” rather than “practice time.”
 - Try to practice in the same place each day. Select a quiet place without distractions.
- Establish a routine. A typical practice session might start with a familiar warm-up piece or simple exercise. Play your instrument scales or technique-building exercises. Then work on a new or difficult piece. End the session by playing something fun.
 - Focus on the difficult parts of your lesson until you have mastered them.
- Push yourself. Playing only a familiar piece of music in the same style will not help you improve.
 - Set goals for each practice session. Keep track of your progress in a practice journal.
 - Spend time practicing alone, with recorded accompaniments, and live with friends.
- Learn from your mistakes. Don't be too critical of yourself. Expect wrong notes, squeaks, and mistakes while practicing. Practice makes perfect!
- Keep practicing. Remember, you will have good days and bad days. You may work on something for a long time with no obvious improvement, and then discover a change in your ability. Anything worth doing takes time and effort!
- Be positive. Never begin to doubt yourself. Believe you will be able to play everything to the best of your ability. It's easy to get discouraged and feel like giving up, but successful people always continue to move forward.
- Explore. Many musicians start out on one instrument, only to switch a few years later to another instrument with much greater success.

Private Lessons

Private Lesson Process & Policy

New and current student referrals for private lessons are carefully handled by our staff and teachers, and are coordinated by the president of the CCSM Board of Directors. Careful thought is given to schedule, availability, level, and experience when selecting a teacher/student match. It is our goal to provide the best possible educational experience for every student enrolled in our programs.

CCSM has a 3-step registration process for private lesson referrals that generally takes between 3-5 days upon submission of the registration form.

- 1) Begin a private lesson referral in-person at the school or at www.claremontmusic.org/Registration-and-Payments.
- 2) A CCSM teacher will contact you to set up a start date/time and email you a brief overview of their background, experience, qualifications, and any additional information.
- 3) Complete registration by contacting the office with your start date/time. A registrar will process the registration and email an invoice.

Private lessons are open to new and continuing students, and all lesson arrangements are made directly with the corresponding instructor. Private lessons are available on most instruments. Suzuki instruction is available for violin, viola, cello, guitar and piano.

Virtual Lessons: For students not wanting to have in-person lessons, virtual lessons are possible via Zoom, Skype, or FaceTime.

Private lesson students joining CCSM for the first time will register for the full academic year and will have a **four-lesson consultation period**. If a student chooses to withdraw prior to the 4th lesson taught, a full refund will be given minus the cost of the initial lessons given. ***It is expected that students will commit to weekly lessons for the remainder of the school year after the consultation period has concluded. There are no makeups or refunds for student-missed lessons.***

Full-term enrollment is required and pro-rated based on week of entry. Tuition payments are due on the 1st of the month (for the forthcoming month), billed September–June. A one-time \$20 student registration fee is applied to each new student account. Payments are considered late if not received by the 10th of the month. A \$25 late fee will be automatically applied to the student's account for past-due balances.

If you will be taking private lessons through a charter school, we must receive the purchase order/enrichment certificate BEFORE your student will be allowed to start lessons. Please make sure to allow plenty of time for your charter school to generate the PO and send it to us.

Master Private Lessons

Master Teachers are available to instruct students of any age and ability who demonstrate a commitment to serious music study. The program is open to everyone, but also includes students who are considering career paths in the world of music or for those desiring to reach artist-level capacity on their voice or instrument. Master teachers are our most highly qualified instructors and possess at least a Master of Arts degree in music (or comparable certification and/or experience teaching at CCSM), widespread performing experience at the artist level, and very strong pedagogical skills.

Master Private lessons may be taken in 15, 30, 45, or 60 minute increments and enable students to progress at a highly motivated pace. It gives the opportunity for advanced students to prepare for performances, auditions and competitions. Students explore varied repertoire and are placed in demanding arenas to accelerate their study of music.

Group Classes

Group Class Process & Policy

CCSM has a 3-step registration process for group class registrations that generally takes between 3-5 days upon submission of the registration form.

- 1) Begin a group class registration in-person at the school or at www.claremontmusic.org/Registration-and-Payments.
- 2) Student will be enrolled by a registrar.
- 3) An invoice for the group class will be emailed to you.

Group classes must be paid for in-full at the time of registration. *Some classes may require materials which are to be purchased ahead of time via the listed online link.* Classes may be cancelled for insufficient enrollment. If a class is cancelled, the tuition of the class will be refunded.

CHARTER STUDENTS: If you will be taking group classes through a charter school, we must receive the purchase order/enrichment certificate BEFORE your student will be allowed to start any classes. Please make sure to allow plenty of time for your charter school to generate the PO and send it to us.

Classes are in-person, unless otherwise indicated, and are subject to change in accordance with public health guidelines.

MUSIC FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

AGES 6 MONTHS - 2 YEARS + PARENT/CAREGIVER

In this wonderful class, our youngest music makers will discover steady beat through fun lap games, floor games and even folk dancing with a parent or caregiver. Infants will participate by responding to songs with intuitive and gross motor skill instruments including bells, shakers, the welcoming drum, and colorful scarves. Claremont Community School of Music is honored group for parade

When the City of Claremont notified the Claremont Community School of Music it was named the honored community group for the city's 2022 Fourth of July celebration and parade, executive director Matthew Keating went digging through the 52-year-old nonprofit's archives.

It had been about three decades since the school's last float made its way along the parade route.

"I actually found old boxes of decorations and things in storage from that, got to kind of go down memory lane and see what it was like," Keating said.

The school is going to be re-using many of those vintage decorations in this year's float, which will feature a 14-member student trumpet ensemble (and a drummer) being pulled on a 26-foot flatbed trailer.

The annual parade will begin at 10 a.m. at Memorial Park, travel down Indian Hill Blvd., turn right at Harrison Ave., and terminate at Larkin Park.

Keating, 38, has been the school's executive director since 2013. He played trumpet in public school while growing up in Upland, and learned to play cello at CCSM, beginning his lessons there in 1985. He, his wife and two daughters live in Claremont now.

Keating has been a parade spectator, of course, but this will be his first as a participant, and the honor carries with it some extra gratitude related to the pandemic's toll on his school and students.

"It's really exciting, especially after two-and-a-half years of not being able to do much at all, to be able to be part of this event," Keating said. "And the kids get to do something in the community. That's the main joy I'm finding."

"It's hard to have a performance without an audience, and this is going to be one of the best audiences that we've had in a long time, and that's why the kids are even more excited."

Things began to change about six months ago, Keating said.

"It's really starting to bounce back, and it's really an exciting time for us," he said

Rehearsal times are based on the availability of students and rehearsal space. On average, rehearsals and lessons occur one time per week for approximately one hour throughout the school year. SUZUKI STRINGS (VIOLIN & VIOLA) PRE-TWINKLERS

AGES: 3 - 7 + PARENT

The Suzuki Violin & Viola Program is designed for students ages 3-7 years old (or by permission of Ms. Tajima).

Dr. Shin'ichi Suzuki developed this incredibly exciting approach to human potential through the study of music. He realized that babies have a very high ability to learn from birth and that through the use of imitation, human beings can learn to a very high degree by the awareness of our surroundings. By using imitative skills, we learn by listening to speech patterns that surround us. We don't learn by someone handing us a book and saying, "Read it!" By being read to, spoken to, and by hearing music, our cognitive skills are built to a very high degree! When lessons begin, by using imitation, we learn how to move and feel the music!

Dr. Suzuki has organized repertoire that the student will learn over the course of 10 books, and each piece introduces a technique to be mastered before moving to other repertoire. The beginning student needs to know how to hold the instrument well before placing the bow on the string for ultimate success! The students learn techniques through the use of games, and learned repertoire is reviewed and performed with other students who know the same pieces! As students become more advanced, they are also introduced to more advanced techniques, which are then used in earlier songs. An important component to learning is LISTENING TO THE CD to introduce how the solo and piano accompaniment fit together, as well as realizing the style of the work.

The ROLE OF THE PARENT/GUARDIAN is also very, very important. It is with this in mind that the parent/guardian must be able to work with the child and understand what is expected. At home you are the "home teacher," and during lessons you are the "secretary"! Regular attendance and practice are essential to progress! ***This class is a year-long commitment in conjunction with private lessons.***

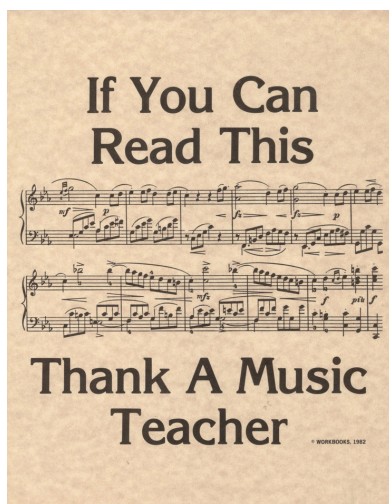

STRING THEORY, EAR TRAINING, MASTERCLASS: STEM - PROGRAM A AGES: 11 - 14

The STEM A Program is for advancing violinists and violists 11-14 years of age and around the CM Level 5. In this 11-session program, students will learn about more advanced theory (scales, arpeggios, major and minor keys, including finding major and minor key signatures and intervals); ear training; concerto works using more advanced shifting techniques and vibrato; and projection while performing. Two topics will be covered almost every session, and there will be homework that students will need to complete between sessions. We will meet in person with face masks and will follow the current LA County guidelines.

Be sure to work very diligently, and if you don't understand something, do not be bashful about telling me! Please remember that there are no "stupid questions"...ALL QUESTIONS HAVE VALUE! This is how EVERYONE LEARNS: by asking questions and observing others.

In the masterclass sessions, students will have opportunities to practice performing in front of others, and each one of us will be able to comment on what was good and what could have been better. We will learn by critiquing others, an excellent tool, and you'll learn so much!

Most class sessions will include theory, and several sessions will also include ear training. It is critically important for students to understand basic theory and music history. It is very important for students to study and complete the assignments, as it makes it difficult to teach otherwise.

Understanding these fundamentals of music aids students in developing a strong awareness of how the composer is using various tools. What an adventure students will have in store as they grasp and utilize these tools when learning a piece!

STRING THEORY, EAR TRAINING, MASTERCLASS: STEM - PROGRAM B AGES: 11 - 14

The STEM B Program is designed to give the advancing student (Intermediate level and up) the knowledge necessary to become competent performers, while being able to spend more time learning about theory, music history, and ear training. The B Session consists of students around CM Levels 7-8 (or equivalent repertoire levels, ages 11-14). We will cover two topics almost every session. There is homework that needs to be completed between sessions. We will meet in-person with face masks and will follow the current LA County guidelines.

During the masterclasses, students will critique each other's performances, whether it is one part of a piece, something being prepared for an upcoming recital or evaluation, or something that a student has learned in the past. Several designated sessions will be performed with an accompanist, so that the entire work can be evaluated. This gives students the chance to become acquainted with various styles, and even if they don't know a composer or work, their musical sense of style is encouraged to state their opinions without fear of being corrected.

Most sessions will cover theory, and several sessions will include ear training. It is critically important that students understand basic theory and music history. If a student is not prepared and hasn't taken the time to study, it makes it very difficult to teach, so being responsible is a MUST! Attendance is important.

The school is back up to 57 teachers and about 1,000 students, which is just about where it was before the pandemic reduced its pupils by half.

"But we found ways to exist in an online environment, and exist in a way where we could still do collaborative audio in a way that didn't have delay or things inherent to Zoom or FaceTime, where you're in a walkie-talkie kind of approach," Keating said. "And that made a big difference."

The online efforts helped to keep some of its chamber music groups and smaller ensembles alive.

The school offers a mixture of private lessons, group classes, ensemble, workshops and special activities. Nearly 15% of the school's students receive scholarships, a fact Keating is quite proud of.

"They're getting the instrument if they need it, including a piano, as well as funding to provide individual private instruction on their instrument, which is really special to be able to do," he said.

"As you know, anything that you do privately is expensive. And especially with music, the kind of attention it takes per instrument to really learn how to do things well, with music theory, part writing, note reading, improvisation, chart reading — anything — it takes a lot of effort and can be expensive. We're fortunate to be able to allow this opportunity for many, many students to be able to do it who may not be able otherwise."

Claremont Community School of Music was founded in 1970 by a group of local music instructors. Since then, it's helped to educate thousands of students from all walks of life, some of whom — like Keating — have returned as instructors.

Keating had nothing but praise for Claremont public school music programs. He sees CCSM as a place where kids can make a deeper dive into their music education, and perhaps speed up the process of becoming well-rounded musicians.

"You can't learn to play piano, for example, in public school, or guitar," he said. "When you're a music teacher — and I've been in this position many times — you get 40 minutes to work with 80 kids on all different instruments, once or twice a week. That's a different experience for the kids and the teacher than if you're able to spend 40 minutes with one person and really help them individually with what they need."

"It's special for us to be able to do this, and help, especially with all the kids in our community that can't afford to buy an instrument, or can't afford to do lessons and couldn't do it otherwise. We're able to help them."

Keating earned his bachelor's degree in orchestral studies with an emphasis in cello performance from California State University, Northridge, in 2007. He then attended the Staatliche Hochschule für Musik Trossingen in Germany, where he continued his education in orchestral conducting and cello performance. He was a part-time cellist in the Honolulu Symphony, and a full-time director of the orchestra program at Honolulu's Punahou School, where he worked with 500 students in eight different orchestras. He also worked as an adjunct professor at Hawaii Pacific University. Keating and his family moved back to California in 2011, and he began teaching cello at CCSM in 2012. He became executive director in 2013.
